Are you currently in a marriage which is not recognized by the Catholic Church? Are you free to marry but thinking of entering marriage with someone who has been previously married and divorced? If so, the staff of the Tribunal for the Diocese of Venice is willing to examine this situation with you so that your standing in the Church can be determined. The Tribunal is the only agency in the diocese with the juridical power to examine and resolve such cases in the external forum. Should you wish additional information, your parish priest can assist you. You are also free to contact the Tribunal office directly at 941-484-9543. Any staff member will be able to provide information.
